

WOULD YOU LIKE TO JOIN KULIGA?

Membership Requirements:

To become a member, you must attend two (2) 8-week Kuliga classes or the equivalent. You are eligible to apply after completing your 12th week of class. Before being confirmed as a member, you must also attend two Membership Meetings (be sure to sign the guest book as a record of your attendance). Annual dues are \$35.00 for a single membership. Additional family members are \$20.00 each and junior trainers (under 16) are \$10.00 each. To apply for membership, ask your instructor for an application or pick one up at a membership meeting. Have your instructor sign the application to verify the classes that you have taken and submit the completed application with a check for membership dues to the Club Secretary or to any board member or officer. The Board will approve your application and assign you a sponsor. Your application will then be voted on by the club members at the next membership meeting. The entire process – from application to approval must be done within a six month period.

SO YOU HAVE JOINED KULIGA, NOW WHAT?

Kuliga membership brings the following benefits:

- You receive our monthly newsletter the Kuliga Kwikies
- You pay significantly reduced class fees for any classes in which you want to participate
- You are eligible for year-end awards for achievement in obedience, rally, agility, conformation and other performance events. In addition, you are eligible for recognition as Instructor of the Year or Volunteer of the Year
- You have the opportunity to get to know other club members through participation in committees, helping at the Fun Match, doing demonstrations, fairs and parades, and other volunteer activities
- You have access to assistance from other members should you have a dog-related behavioral problem
- You have access to Kuliga's library of books about obedience, health, behavior and breed specifics.
- You can become a keyholder by paying a key deposit and agreeing to abide by the rules for keyholders. As a keyholder, you can train your dog(s) at our facility outside of regular class times, as long as there is a free training ring.
